# EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT- Fullerton Troop 292 ABRAM FUENTES BUILDS A PATIO COVER BETWEEN THE STORAGE SHEDS

Eagle Scout, Abram Fuentes chose the Fullerton Train Museum to pursue his Eagle Scout Leadership Honor. Eagle Scout is the highest achievement or rank attainable in the Scouts BSA program of the Boy Scouts of America (BSA). Since its inception in 1911, only four percent of Scouts have earned this rank after a lengthy review process.

Abram was responsible for coordinating with FTM staff to design and build the Patio Cover between the storage sheds. This included coordinating and managing his volunteers, getting materials and day-of construction.

The project provides protection from the elements for work projects and a covered location for docents to be out of the sun to meet and greet visitors at the entrance to the museum. We began the project on September 17 with the painting, assembly and installation of the support frames and placing the roof joists. The following weekend, the facia boards, joist blocking, sheeting, underlayment, drip strip and roofing material were installed. The project is complete!

A BIG "thank you" from the museum to Abram, his fellow boy scouts, their fathers, and Abram's family for a job well done. Their efforts are greatly appreciated.

VIDEO LIBRARY—a video library has been created in the Palm Leaf. Older VHS and cassettes are in the process of being converted to disc for the new video player equipment.

KITCHEN in UP 5001 and BAR in UP 6101 — we now have running water in both areas.

FAIRMONT SPEEDER — the speeder is operational along with the trailer for passengers. Opening TBD. Operators are undergoing training and insurance and liability waivers are being put in place.

POWER WASHER — a new power washer will be used to clean equipment and prepare for painting, roof coatings and normal cleaning.
