


First Place: Wyatt Smith age 9, Third Grade, Fern Drive School, Mrs. Ahn - "Keep Your 'Selfie' Safe"


Second Place: Leah Lee, age 6, First Grade, Laguna Road School, Ms. Schade - "Don't Play Near the Tracks"


Number one for your consideration is to bring a snack to share. Number two is a donation to the Film Fund (cash container will be on the bar.)


For those who simply and unabashedly just want to bring beauty back to life, there’s plenty of stainless trim needing your personal touch in the passenger cars.
